RAIL TRAIL GATES AND TRAILS IN SOUTHERN NH CLOSING FOR SEASON

(Concord, NH) The New Hampshire Bureau of Trails announces that gates on recreational rail trails in southern and central New Hampshire will be closing this week for the riding season. Trail users should expect to find the gate bars closed over the next several days on the Cheshire, Ashuelot, Fort Hill, Monadnock, Greenville, Hillsborough, Sugar River, Rockingham and Farmington Recreational Rail Trails.

Gates in southern state parks and forests, as well as snowmobile trails in Bear Brook, Pawtuckaway and Pisgah State Parks will remain open. Snowmobile Corridor 9/11, the Concord-Lincoln Rail Corridor, closed for the season on March 16th. Riders should check the Bureau of Trails website for trail condition updates through March and local club sites for information.

The Bureau of Trails is a part of the NH Division of Parks & Recreation. The Division manages over 73 state parks, campgrounds, historic sites, waysides, natural areas, and thousands of miles of trails.
